





PURPOSE

To provide a positive environment where you can develop your potential and achieve maximum independence.

Pine Castle is a place to learn and develop new friendships while pursuing personal development, career development, community engagement, and employment opportunities.





The Academy Pathways

Each participant can choose from two different pathways to success — the Pathway to Life Enrichment or the Pathway to Community Employment.

The Pine Castle Academy features a customized curriculum, providing a college-like experience for participants. Each participant has an individualized daily schedule that includes time for skill-building with the Pathways curriculum, their choice of extra-curricular activities like band, chorus, Special Olympics, etc., as well as options for Mental Health Services and working time if they are in the Employment Pathway. The Academy has two semesters per year, and participants can choose different courses or extra-curricular activities each semester.

Both pathways include weekly field trips for up to ten participants at a time in a small group setting utilizing our two campus buses. One bus is dedicated to the Pathway to Community Employment and includes job exploration field trips. The other bus is used for the Life Enrichment Pathway and includes cultural and civic outings.

On the Employment Pathway, participants earn at least minimum wage while working on job training skills and contracts, including manufacturing assembly, the wood shop, and trade crew training in Culinary, Custodial, or Maintenance. Upon completion of the Employment Pathway, participants receive guidance from a Job Coach to help them secure employment in the community, and ultimately achieve greater independence.

Community Employment Pathway

Our staff work closely with each participant using customized curriculum to guide them in preemployment skill building and learning opportunities.

Community Employment

Once a participant has completed their Pre-Vocational Employment Pathway Training, they begin working with our Community Employment Division to find their job in the community. The Job Coaches will help them with job search assistance, and work preparation planning. This offers participants guidance through the application process, dressing for success, interviewing, time management, transportation, and proper work etiquette for future community employment.

Welcome Home

Pine Castle owns and operates five community group homes (two women's, one men's, and two co-ed), as well as one independent living home.

Through the assistance and guidance of 24-hour staff and nursing support, residents learn self-care and homemaking skills such as cooking, laundry, housekeeping, grooming, money management, and decision making. Each group home environment provides opportunities to develop and maintain social relationships within the community.

Senior Programming

Our Senior Program is designed for individuals with IDD who have retired from community employment and/or whose differences are compounded by age-related changes, such as dementia or physical limitations. Participants engage in a variety of person-centered activities that focus on reminiscence simulation, cognitive stimulation, social interaction, and maintenance of daily living skills.

Our seniors can choose to have their nails done by their Direct Support Professional in the salon, enjoy coffee with peers in the coffee shop, or enjoy a movie in our movie theater. Individuals in the Senior Program also enjoy a variety of community visitors including musicians, volunteers, and university participants that help promote social interaction and engagement.

Friendship Way

Our Friendship Village is a space offering reminiscence therapy, which stimulates mental activity and evokes memories. We've converted an area into a unique environment in which painted murals, furnishings, and props recreate a village. This environment helps replicate lifestyles from earlier years, which helps individuals recall some of their older memories. Participants experience a greater sense of normalcy and the reminiscence spaces, filled with scenes from the past, prolong lifetime memories.



The program currently has 36 senior adult participants and continues to grow as people age. Adults with intellectual differences are prone to early-onset Alzheimer's and dementia and symptoms may begin manifesting in their 40s. It is for these individuals and their families that the reminiscence room will be a crucial part of keeping memories alive.

Pine Castle has staff that is highly skilled and trained by the National Task Group of Intellectual Disabilities and Dementia Practices.



Personalized Care for Intensive Needs

For individuals with more severe intellectual and physical differences, we offer a sensory-based curriculum that helps promote physical, cognitive, and social wellness. They'll engage in a variety of sensory activities throughout the day that involve sight, sound, taste, smell, touch, and movement.

Our dedicated Direct Support Professionals also assist individuals with mobility, feeding, hygiene, and behavioral needs, as needed, in order to increase the individual's overall quality of life.

Mental Health

Holistic Approach

The Pine Castle mental health program is designed to treat the whole person. We achieve this through personalized assessments and care with a licensed practitioner, individualized, evidence-based treatment and activities focused on building holistic well-being.

Psychosocial Rehabilitation (PSR)

As part of our Psychosocial Rehabilitation Program (PSR), we help educate our participants on their co-occurring IDD and mental health conditions. We work with participants on their coping skills, reduce symptoms, improve relationships and much more.

Personalized 1-On-1

The Participants receive counseling with a client-centered therapeutic approach using a variety of evidence-based practices in a one-on-one setting.

Are there key admission dates to Pine Castle?

No, a participant can apply any time of the year. However, just like college admissions typically we see more admissions in late summer and early spring.

How many participants are enrolled in Pine Castle?

Pine Castle can enroll up to 350 adults.

How old do you need to be to apply for Pine Castle?

You need to be 18 with a Special Education Graduate Certificate or 21 with a diagnosis from your doctor before the age of 18 with an intellectual or developmental disability.

How can I pay for the services of Pine Castle?

In some cases, the State of Florida will provide some payment if you have funding through the Agency for Persons with Disabilities (APD) iBudget waiver – you can apply a portion of that budget to your services at Pine Castle. Pine Castle also offers private pay options as well. Monthly Social Security payments can also be applied to pay for Pine Castle Day Program Services.

What are the steps for application?

- 1. Fill out the pre-application located on our website to submit.
- 2. Schedule a Tour and fill out all other necessary paperwork.
- 3. Determine your payment preferences, either through the state of Florida or private pay.
- 4. A Case Manager will be assigned for assessment.

Is there Medical Care on Campus?

Pine Castle has a board-certified nurse on campus to handle a multitude of conditions, if needed, along with medication administration.

What are classroom ratios?

If you are using iBudget waiver dollars, APD will assign your staff ratio, either 1:3 (1 staff per 3 participants) or 1:5 or 1:10. Each classroom is staffed accordingly.

Is your campus open?

Yes, our campus is open. Participants can move around our campus freely but are on timed schedules each semester, so we know where a participant is at any given time. Participants that are capable to go off campus may do so.

What types of jobs and career opportunities can be explored?

There are numerous opportunities from our onlocation woodshop, to our custodial or culinary service or maintenance crews for training in skilled trades or assembly manufacturing jobs.

Do you partner with local businesses for employment opportunities?

With Pine Castle's long history with local community and business partnerships, Pine Castle's participants can find enjoyable employment throughout regional businesses like Publix, Bruster's Ice Cream, and more.

How does Pine Castle support participants in setting and achieving their long-term goals?

Our staff is highly credentialed and is on the cutting edge of service innovations providing our participants the best opportunities. Participants set their own goals each semester and their Case Manager, Direct Support Professional and other staff help them track and achieve their goals.

Are there opportunities to learn hands-on skills?

Pine Castle takes immense pride in administering hands-on programming for participants. They can learn woodshop skills and make retail items for our online marketplace and community retail partners. We also offer training in manufacturing to assemble products for local manufacturers. Our garden club and all of our trade crews learn hands-on skills. There are a multitude of opportunities.

Do you have a residential program?

Yes, through the assistance and guidance of 24-hour staff support. The goal is to foster the growth of every participant's self-reliance. The application for residential services is handled separately. For more information contact the Director of Residential Services at 904.733.2650.

Do you take Seniors over the age of 55?

Yes, we have a Senior adult program that specializes in appropriate senior programming and activities — in some cases, adults with IDD experience age-related conditions, i.e. Alzheimer's and dementia, earlier than the typical population.

Do you have a Memory Care program?

Yes, the rate for Alzheimer's and dementia is greater for individuals with IDD. Pine Castle provides a safe monitored program that allows individuals to feel safe, encourages participation in extracurricular and social activities, and more.

What are the hours of operation?

The Academy is open M-F from 8:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. and the Administration offices are open M-F 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
