

A Proposal to Lory Doolittle and The Doolittle Trust

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

During its more than 70-year history, Pine Castle has evolved into a beloved resource for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD). Founded on the principle of creating a safe and supportive environment, we have become a pillar of the community, offering education, vocational training, and compassionate care. While we've accomplished much, including a recent campus renovation and the elimination of long-standing mortgage debt, our current foundation needs strengthening as we look toward the future.

Since early 2023, Pine Castle has faced significant financial and operational challenges. Changes in government agency billing systems caused months of delayed payments, leaving the organization in a vulnerable position. Additionally, the long-awaited Employee Retention Tax Credit of more than \$600,000 has yet to arrive, further impeding our financial recovery. Enrollment, once at a steady 300 participants, declined sharply post-pandemic, and while we've made strides in increasing our numbers, we have not yet returned to our pre-pandemic capacity.

Compounding these issues are rising operational costs, particularly due to mandated minimum wage increases and escalating expenses related to maintaining our aging infrastructure. With a large 10-acre campus and multiple facilities including five group homes, recent equipment failures have resulted in additional financial strain, forcing us to divert resources toward critical repairs.

To secure the future of Pine Castle and for the participants that rely on us, we must undergo a transformation NOW. Much like carbon responds to pressure by becoming a diamond, we aim to become stronger, more resilient, and enduring, but achieving this vision requires significant investment. A transformational gift will provide the rock-solid foundation we need to continue serving individuals with I/DD for generations to come.







CURRENT CHALLENGES AND SETBACKS

In 2023, Pine Castle faced numerous setbacks due to changes from major income sources like APD (Agency for Persons with Disabilities) and VR (Vocational Rehabilitation), including billing code updates and new software system implementations that didn't function properly for months and caused serious cash flow issues. Though many of these problems have been resolved, Pine Castle is still recovering financially. Additionally, a \$600,000 IRS Employee Retention Tax Credit (ERC) refund has been delayed for nearly two years, further straining cash flow.

Enrollment, once a steady 300 participants pre-pandemic, dropped to 165 post-pandemic due to various factors, and Medicaid funding for new participants became unavailable. Pine Castle has since pivoted to serve private-pay families and has increased enrollment to 225, though this is still below the historic 300 needed for sustainability.

Rising labor costs are another challenge. Florida's mandated minimum wage increases affect participant and staff wages, and a recent Medicaid rate hike only brings Medicaid funding to 82% of the agency's cost to serve a participant. Additionally, unexpected air conditioning failures due to the 2024 heatwave, slab leaks due to old and outdated galvanized piping and roof issues have added significant repair costs, further straining

Despite these challenges, Pine Castle remains hopeful and focused on its mission of education, life skills, and vocational training. With increasing competition from universities offering programs for individuals with I/DD, Pine Castle has found its niche in hands-on vocational and life skills training. While others may target serving the highest-functioning individuals, Pine Castle aims to serve those who need more life skills coaching and practical job training.

Pine Castle is a well-respected, long-standing organization in the Jacksonville community. **As one of the oldest agencies in the Northeast Florida region**, Pine Castle is uniquely suited to address the unmet needs of adults with intellectual and developmental differences.



INNOVATIVE CURRICULUM

The award-winning Pathways Curriculum, recognized by the Florida Association of Rehabilitation Facilities, is attracting new participants, and six other Florida agencies have purchased the program, confirming we are leading the way.

DEDICATED STAFF

Staff turnover rates are decreasing, providing consistent care for participants.

CAPACITY FOR GROWTH

A recent study shows the agency can serve up to 450 participants, doubling current enrollment.

CERTIFIED APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAMS

The agency offers certified training in culinary, and custodial work, and hands-on experience in woodshop, and manufacturing fields, preparing participants for community jobs.

NEW OPPORTUNITIES

A new aquaponics greenhouse project will provide fresh produce for the agency and create potential revenue through community sales and partnerships with local grocers and schools.

SECURING THE FUTURE

Pine Castle is a product of more than 70 years of success, but it needs a stronger foundation to withstand current and future challenges. With payroll costs of \$6 million annually, the existing safety nets of \$1 million in Long Term Reserves and \$1 million in endowments are not enough for our future sustainability.



STABILIZATION

\$1 million to address outstanding operational debt service, campus and facility repairs, mandated minimum wage increases and establish a stronger foundation through a new working capital fund and enhanced capital structure.



SECURITY

\$500k to grow the Long-Term Reserve Fund, increasing safety net reserves from two months to six months.



SUSTAINABILITY

\$500k to fund five different **Evergreen Legacy Society** Quasi – Endowment Funds for critical programs, \$100,000 for each. These invested funds include Health and Wellness (Nursing and Mental Health), Education Academy (Pathway to Life Enrichment), Community Living (Group Homes), **Employment Training and** Job Placement (Pathway to Community Employment) and Sustainability Fund (Mission Support).
